Attitude

The number one thing in my opinion that makes someone more successful and that's their attitude. I know some people might think that's not a good tip, but really I'm telling you that of all the people that I've worked with in the past, the ones with the positive attitude and the resilience and the willingness to do what it takes are the ones that actually have success. That comes ahead of what their experience and qualifications are. Obviously they qualify for sponsorship but they're not necessarily someone who has 10 years and extensive qualifications. So the number one is definitely the attitude.

I know it's really challenging to find a sponsored job in Australia, and if you just have the determination to succeed and to stay positive no matter how many knock-backs you get and just stay on course and keep at it knowing that eventually you'll knock on the right door and it will open, then you'll definitely have more success than anyone else because a lot of people give up because they just find it too hard, and they think, "Well, I haven't had any positive responses so fast, so it must be useless. But if they just keep at it and stay positive and just keep trying, they'll eventually get there.

CV or Resume

The reason this is so important is because this is your first first chance to make an impression on an employer or recruiter. The thing to keep in mind is that recruiters and hiring managers have to look at a hundred and sometimes more CVs every day. So I end up finding a way to make quick decisions and I'll usually make a decision within a few seconds of looking at a CV.

So if your CV doesn't hit the spot within a few seconds, likely you won't get invited for an interview. So it really is so important. I know around the world CVs are different in different countries. For example Canada and the US have a one-page resume and it's so short and to the point and that's enough for them, whereas in Australia, employees want a bit more information because you have to really sell why you're the person for the job, and if your CV is too short, then you're not going to do a very good job at selling that. So that's why number two is very important. I do recommend that even though it can be a little bit pricey, but it really is worthwhile getting your resume professionally written.

How do you get a great CV?

You probably already have a CV (resume) but is it working? At the bottom of this document is a template. This is a great starting point, but it is recommended that you seek out a professional CV writer to make your experience shine in the right light.

Hidden Job Market

Use the hidden job market and to really leverage on networks. Most people these days know that the hidden job market are all those jobs that aren't being advertised. Some people estimate that there's up to 90 percent of jobs in that category which is a huge amount. So what you're seeing on the job search websites is such a small number of jobs that are actually available. Using the hidden job market will open up opportunities to you and you can do that by using tools such as LinkedIn.

LinkedIn is such an important tool for job search for anyone, but for employer sponsorship it has had awesome results for clients of mine. A lot of my clients have had more success using LinkedIn than applying directly for jobs that are advertised on the job search websites.


